이 책에는 2026년 Digital SAT 에 자주 나오는 단어 650개가 실려 있다. 한국어 번역은 일부러 넣지 않았다. SAT 는 단어를 아는지 묻지 않고, 문장 안에서 그 단어가 어떤 역할을 하는지 묻기 때문이다.

하루 25단어씩 26일이면 한 바퀴를 돈다. 한 바퀴로 끝나는 단어장은 없다. 첫 바퀴는 모르는 단어를 고르는 데 쓰고, 둘째 바퀴부터 그 단어만 다시 본다. 매주 마지막에 있는 복습 페이지는 뜻을 가린 채 단어만 보고 풀이를 떠올리는 자리다.

이렇게 쓴다

- **영어 풀이를 그대로 읽는다.** 풀이 문장 자체가 그 단어가 쓰이는 문맥이다. 한 단어짜리 한국어 번역으로 바꾸는 순간 문맥이 사라진다.
- **전치사가 붙은 항목은 통째로.** exposure to, dependence on 처럼 전치사째 실린 단어는 시험에도 그 짝으로 나온다.
- **주간 복습은 소리 내어.** 단어를 보고 풀이가 입에서 나오면 넘어가고, 막히면 그 단어의 번호를 적어 둔다.
- **찾아보기는 마지막에.** 지문에서 만난 단어가 이 책에 있는지 확인할 때 쓴다. 쪽 번호로 돌아가 풀이를 다시 읽는다.
